Revised School Day:

A reminder that from September the school gate will be opened at 8.35am and children may come into the playground as long as they are supervised.

The classrooms will open at 8.40am with **registration taking place at 8.45am**. The school day will finish 3.15pm as it does currently.

Breakfast Club:

The school will be taking over the running of Breakfast Club from September. The club will run from 8.00am – 8.40am (to reflect the new school start time). The cost will remain at £4.50 per child per session. Payment will be made through ParentPay.

Parents will need to book at least 48 hours in advance if they require a session. This is because we will only be running the club if there are bookings. Staff will not be on site otherwise. If you book a session but then don't attend, you will still be charged as staff cover will have been arranged.

Summer Medal Making Competition:

As part of the Godolphin Cross Festival of Archaeology, the school has been invited to collaborate in a unique competition which is exclusive to the children of Godolphin Primary School. Children are asked to design a new medal for Godolphin Cross, making use of the local area. Further information has been uploaded to the School Google Classrooms, where more details about the specifications can be found.

Entries will need to be submitted by Friday 8th September, either by uploading a picture to your child's Google Classroom, or bringing a hard copy of the design into school in the first week back.

Prizes will be awarded for the winning design for each year group (including the current reception up to year 6). An overall winner will then be selected and their design carved into lead, pressed into casting sand, and cast using smelted tin to create an actual tin medal.

This is an exciting and unique opportunity, and we hope to see as many entries as possible. Good luck!



Godolphin Cross Medal Competition

Have a go at creating a design for a new medal for Godolphin Cross. Using the local area, its history, the landscape, buildings, plants and animals as inspiration.

Zircon Class Archaeological Dig:

As part of the Godolphin Cross Festival of Archaeology the Zircon Class was invited to Wheal Breage to take part in an excavational dig.

The children were involved in unveiling what is thought to have been a miner's dwelling from over 200 years ago.

During the morning, the class spent time trowelling and brushing away the soil, using their senses to identify clues that something may be hidden in the ground. They also used tooth brushes to clean some of artefacts that had already been found on the site, including pottery, a variety of rocks and even an old miner's pick axe head. For some of the children there was even an opportunity to try out using a metal detector.

Another year done, yet again it feels like we've flown through to the end of the school year in the blink of an eye!

On behalf of the governors, and I'm sure the parents too, I would like to say a huge thank-you to all the staff. This year hasn't been without its challenges with the move over to Crofty MAT and the changes to our staff team, but everyone has gone the extra mile and worked together to ensure the children continue to thrive and enjoy everything school has to offer.

As governors, we have been adapting to working within a different Multi-Academy Trust and have been pleased to see the positive changes that Crofty are bringing to our school. We have continued our monitoring work and have investigated many areas of school life including curriculum development, maths, staff well-being, communication, behaviour, reading in key stage 2 and the introduction of RWInc – our new phonics scheme. This monitoring has highlighted many areas of progress and success. RWInc is proving very popular with children, staff, and families as a fun, engaging and effective approach to phonics. We have also had lots of positive feedback about the increased use of Google Classrooms to share pictures and videos of what the children get up to in their days at school. I know many parents have appreciated being able to see the children enjoying themselves on trips and sports events as well as all the exciting activities they get up to in the classroom!

We're delighted with the school's results this year which are testament to the hard work of all the children and staff. There is a huge amount of unseen work in a school that helps each individual child reach their potential, not just academically, but also in their personal development in helping them to become confident, well-rounded young people ready for their next steps. This is a real strength of small school such as ours. Being a school governor is a great way to help support the school and contribute to the education of the children.
