Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell. We are also aware of cases of Covid in the local community. We therefore thought it was worth sharing the following NHS link regarding childhood illness.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school on the first day (and subsequent days) providing a reason for the absence.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.

Please can we request that when you buzz the buzzer to gain access to the playground you enter and shut the gate after you and don't let anyone else in at the same time. They will need to buzz in separately (even if this is another family from the school).

Breakfast Club & After-School Clubs:

The school is now running the Breakfast Club. The club runs from 8.00am – 8.40am (to reflect the new school start time). The cost will remain at £4.50 per child per session. Payment will be made through ParentPay.

Parents will need to book at least 48 hours in advance if they require a session. This is because we will only be running the club if there are bookings. Staff will not be on site otherwise. If you book a session but then don't attend, you will still be charged as staff cover will have been arranged.
