Children are asked to design a new medal for Godolphin Cross, making use of the local area. Entries will need to be submitted by 29th September, either by uploading a picture to your child's Google Classroom, or bringing a hard copy of the design into school.

Prizes will be awarded for the winning design for each class. An overall winner will then be selected and their design carved into lead, pressed into casting sand, and cast using smelted tin to create an actual tin medal.
