Please come and join them to find out what new things are going on and let them know any thoughts you have about Godolphin too.



All entries must be in school on the morning of **Monday 4**th **March** for judging. Winners will be announced on Thursday 7th March and the jars will be available for viewing by the whole school as part of our World Book Day celebrations. Good luck!
