Registration:

Literary Festival:

Last Tuesday a group of Year 5 and Year 6 children were invited to attend a literary festival at Penwith College.

The day was divided into three workshops focussing on how authors create their characters, imaginary worlds and character development and were led by children's authors Lou Abercrombie, Vashti Hardy and Nicholas Browning.

The children's love of literature and passion for reading was evident during the workshops. They were each presented with a voucher (sponsored by Seasalt) to exchange for one of the author's books. One of the highlights was having their books signed by the author, when they were able to chat to them about their reading and interests.

The children were not alone in being a little starstruck, a highlight of the year for Mrs Knight was being 'encouraged ' by Bradley and Dexter to "Go and speak to..." one of her favourite authors - Patrick Gale, who was there as patron of the Penzance Literary Festival.

The finale in the lecture theatre was led by Martin Brown, illustrator of the Horrible Histories series. He entertained the children with his humour and incredible drawings, one of which Mrs Gee talked him into letting us keep!

We were incredibly proud of the children's behaviour and engagement in the day - we will definitely be looking to sign up for next year's festival! Some quotes from the children:
