## Scarlet Fever:

We are aware that scarlet fever is in the local community.

The early symptoms of scarlet fever include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours, the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. Patients typically have flushed cheeks and are pale around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a bright red 'strawberry' tongue.

If you think your child may have it, please contact your GP. The advice from the Health Protection team is not to attend school until 24 hours after commencing the appropriate antibiotic treatments. If no antibiotics are administered, the individual will be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks and should remain off school for this period.
