Diamonds dentist visit:

On Monday, we had a visit from the dentist. As part of our Science learning this half term, Emily kindly offered to teach the children about dental health and hygiene and dentistry as a career. The children identified which foods and drinks are healthy for teeth and those that can cause holes/cavities which lead to rotting teeth and the need for fillings. We had great fun crunching a purple disclosing tablet which showed up areas of our teeth and gums that we could clean more thoroughly

Emily showed the children how to brush with a manual toothbrush in circles and how to move the brush up and down when using an electric brush. We learnt about the importance of looking in the mirror when brushing and to also brush our tongues – especially after using a disclosing tablet! "I learnt that I should spit out but not rinse as I want the fluoride to protect my teeth." (Y4). "I found out that I need to brush my gums better as there was a lot of purple there." (Y2). The children recalled previous learning, naming the different teeth and their roles.

A huge thank you to Emily, for making the learning so engaging. She commented on how impressed she was with their attitude and behaviour for learning and is keen to return!





Zircon Class - heart dissection:

Last week, the Zircon class welcomed local vet, Mrs Ivey, into their classroom for a science lesson they will never forget...

As a follow-up to their previous week's introduction to the human circulatory system, including the heart, Mrs Ivey skilfully performed a dissection of a 'rather large' pig's heart in front of the inquisitive children. The pupils were completely fixated and were able to identify some of the main features, such as the atria, ventricles, valves and blood vessels.

Feeling brave, many of the children jumped at the chance to touch this vital organ to see what it would feel like.

Thank you very much to Mrs Ivey for providing the class with such a valuable scientific experience.



This week in science, the children made their own blood, using various food items to represent red blood cells, white blood cells, platelets and plasma.


Comic Relief Red Nose Day:
