Overall school attendance for this week was 95.48% (of which 1.92% was unauthorised).

Building Work Update – Relocation Plans:

As you are aware, work to replace two of the school's Elliot huts is due to begin on **Monday 30th June**. We fully appreciate that this raises questions and concerns, particularly around the relocation of children for the remainder of the term.

We want to reassure you that your child's **education, safety, and wellbeing remain our highest priorities** throughout this period of change. We are committed to maintaining a calm, familiar, and supportive environment for all pupils.

Following a very productive meeting this week, we are pleased to share that the final plans have now been agreed in principle.

However, we must wait for formal confirmation in writing before we are able to release full details. Assuming there are no unforeseen delays, we are very hopeful that a letter will be sent to all parents and carers **on Monday**, outlining the full arrangements. This will include information about lesson locations, drop-off and collection procedures, lunchtime arrangements, and any offsite activities.

We can already reassure you that it is highly likely that children will remain **based within the village**, with **The Old Chapel** and the **school field** forming central parts of the temporary setup.

Thank you once again for your continued patience, trust, and support as we work hard to ensure a smooth and positive experience for the children during this important project.
